Subject: Khrushchev's Message 61 years ago (1959)

A sobering reminder from sixty years ago when Russia's Khrushchev delivered these ominous words (People just laughed, but look at us now!!! Scary):

"Your children's children will live under communism... you Americans are so gullible. No, you won't accept communism outright; but we will keep feeding you small doses of socialism until you will finally wake up and find you already have Communism. We will not have to fight you; We will so weaken your economy, until you will fall like over ripe fruit into our hands. The democracy will cease to exist when you take away from those who are willing to work and give to those who would not."

How to create a social state (Remember, socialism leads to Communism):

There are 8 levels of control; read the following recipe:

- 1) Healthcare Control healthcare and you control the people.
- 2) Poverty Increase the poverty level as high as possible, poor people are easier to control and will not fight back if you are providing everything for them.
- 3) Debt Increase the debt to an unsustainable level. That way you are able to increase taxes, and this will produce more poverty.
- 4) Gun Control Remove the ability to defend themselves from the Government. That way you are able to create a police state.
- 5) Welfare Take control of every aspect (food, housing, income) of their lives because that will make them fully dependent on the government.
- 6) Education Take control of what people read and listen to and take control of what children learn in school.
- 7) Religion Remove the belief in God from the Government and schools because the people need to believe in ONLY the government knowing what is best for the people.
- 8) Class Warfare Divide the people into the wealthy and the poor. Eliminate the middle class This will cause more discontent and it will be easier to tax the wealthy with the support of the poor

Many people believe the above eight steps to socialism were the work of Saul Alinsky (a socialist, community activist in Chicago whose goal was to turn America into a socialist state). However, that doesn't appear to be true. The source is anonymous and appears to be a variant of the decades-old *Communist Rules for Revolution* piece that was originally passed along without attribution until Alinsky's name became attached to it. The nearest thing Alinsky produced was his list of "power tactics" outlined in his 1971 book *Rules for Radicals*. Regardless of the source, the list, in relation to current events, is rather frightening. Particularly when you consider that in Marxist theory, socialism is merely a transitional social state between the overthrow of capitalism and the realization of communism.

Communist Rules for Revolution

(In May 1919 at Dusseldorf, Germany, the allied forces discovered a copy of these 'Rules.' They were first printed in the United States in the 'Bartlesville (Oklahoma) Examiner-Enterprise' the same year, 1919.)

- 1. Corrupt the young, get them away from religion. Get them interested in sex. Make them superficial. Destroy their ruggedness.
- 2. Get control of all means of publicity.
- 3. Get people's minds off their government by focusing their attention on athletics, sexy books and other trivialities.
- 4. Divide the people into hostile groups by constantly harping on controversial matters of no importance.
- 5. Destroy the people's faith in their natural leaders by holding the latter up to contempt and ridicule.
- 6. Always preach true democracy, but seize power as fast and as ruthlessly as possible.
- 7. By encouraging government extravagance, destroy its credit and produce fear of inflation with rising prices and general discontent.
- 8. Foment unnecessary strikes in vital industries, encourage civil disorders, and foster a lenient and soft attitude on the part of government toward such disorders.
- 9. By specious argument cause the breakdown of the old moral virtues, honesty, sobriety, continence, faith in the pledged word, ruggedness.
- 10. Cause the registration of all firearms on some pretext, with a view to confiscating them and leaving the populace helpless.

Rules for Radicals: A Pragmatic Primer for Realistic Radicals – Saul Alinsky

The Rules

- "Power is not only what you have but what the enemy thinks you have."
- "Never go outside the expertise of your people."
- "Whenever possible go outside the expertise of the enemy."
- "Make the enemy live up to its own book of rules."
- "Ridicule is man's most potent weapon."
- "A good tactic is one your people enjoy."
- "A tactic that drags on too long becomes a drag."
- "Keep the pressure on."
- "The threat is usually more terrifying than the thing itself."
- "The major premise for tactics is the development of operations that will maintain a constant pressure upon the opposition."
- "If you push a negative hard and deep enough it will break through into its counterside."
- "The price of a successful attack is a constructive alternative."
- "Pick the target, freeze it, personalize it, and polarize it."
